Grant Highlight VICM Imagination Library


CFVI continues to support <u>Dolly Parton's Imagination</u>

VI have access to this FREE opportunity!



Program Highlight CFVI Junior Angels

The St. Thomas Junior Angels most recent projects include working with CFVI grantee *All Hands and Hearts - Smart Response* (AHAH) on the restoration of

the Alvin McBean Recreation Park, thanks to the support of the Puma Energy Foundation. In addition to their individual site placements, Junior Angels also volunteer as a group at various sites and community events, including a Red Ribbon Week Celebration held by the Boys & Girls Club of St. Thomas.

One of our St. Croix Junior Angels was recently singled out during testimony presented before the 33rd Legislature (Committee on Health, Hospitals, and Human Services)! Ms. Clema S. Lewis (Executive Director of Women's Coalition of St. Croix) highlighted *Keshawn A. Merchant* (a 12th grader at Central High School) for his outstanding community service. Ms. Lewis recognized the funding partnership with CFVI as critical and an example of unique programming to ensure young people value their community.

Grantee Highlight Love City Strong - St. John Mold Remediation Project

Beginning shortly after Hurricanes Irma and Maria, Love City Strong assembled and coordinated a group for mold remediation services with funding provided from the Fund for the Virgin Islands (FFVI) at CFVI.

LCS provided mold sanitation to a variety of vulnerable residents on St. John through a partnership with a professional organization known as the National Organization of Remediators and Mold Instructors (NORMI). They also trained and licensed 10 different St. John residents in mold sanitation and remediation techniques to perform the work throughout the course of the program. A secondary goal of this program is to ensure the availability of deployable assets in the event of a future natural disaster, so that mold sanitation and remediation can begin as soon as possible after the event.

Members of the Annie E. Casey Foundation Visit Territory

In February, CFVI hosted several days of community partner meetings as well as an intimate gathering with a variety of stakeholders and community members to celebrate 20 years of KIDS COUNT leadership in the USVI as a member of the Annie E. Casey KIDS COUNt Network. The week also welcomed program officers from the Annie E. Casey Foundation, Karina Jimenez Lewis and Selena Tan who had the opportunity to meet with community partners and gain a deeper



understanding of the challenges and needs facing children and families in the Territory.

New Fund Highlight Island Spirit Fund

Following the 2017 hurricane season, St. Croix-based Cruzan® Rum wanted to establish a direct aid fund that would ensure that in the future no one would have to "weather a storm alone". Through a partnership with GlobalGiving, Cruzan® established the Island Spirit Fund in an effort to create a direct response to the ongoing needs of communities affected by the storms. Through donations of \$1 dollar for every case of rum sold (and several distribution partners who have joined the case-matching commitment), the Island Spirit Fund is supporting 5 initiatives/organizations in the USVI, including CFVI. Island Spirit has set a goal that by 2022, they will raise \$10 million.
