CFVI Named Library of Congress' Center for the Book




The Community Foundation of the Virgin Islands (CFVI) has been honored by the Library of Congress with an invitation to serve as the Center for the Book for the U.S. Virgin Islands.

The inclusion of CFVI as the USVI Center for the Book completes the list of participants to include all 50 States, Washington, D.C. and each of the U.S. Territories. As the USVI affiliate, CFVI will collaborate with the Library on literacy programming, services, and collections, develop independent local programs and literary heritage projects, including developing initiatives and public programs to promote literacy, reading, book arts, poetry, and USVI literary heritage.

"We are pleased to welcome the new U.S. Virgin Islands Center for the Book as the newest affiliate to help promote reading with the Center for the Book at the Library of Congress," said Librarian of Congress Carla Hayden. "CFVI and the USVI Center already have demonstrated a commitment to the mission of promoting books, reading and literacy with its many programs."

Walter E. Washington Convention Center, Washington, D.C.

As part of its role as a Center for the Book, CFVI will host a table at the 2022 National Book Festival on **Saturday, September 3rd** at the Walter E. Washington Convention Center in Washington, D.C.

The festival, free and open to the public, is one of the most prominent literary events in the United States, with an anticipated attendance of more than 200,000 visitors. Established in 2001, the festival is an opportunity to bring together best-selling authors and thousands of readers for author talks, panel discussions, book signings, and other activities.

As part of the festival, each state and territory Center for the Book is invited to name an adult book and a children's book as its designated Great Reads for 2022 and a list of the books is distributed during the festival. Books may be written by authors from the state, take place in the state, or celebrate the state's culture and heritage. More information about the USVI's designated books will be announced soon.

CFVI Awards \$162,631 in Scholarships to 57 Virgin Islands Students

The Foundation has distributed more than \$3.4 million in scholarships since 1996



CFVI awarded \$162,131 in scholarships to 57 Virgin Islands students for its 2022-23 academic scholarship cycle. Applications were submitted by a competitive applicant pool of 175 students. Award recipients were selected by a review committee of more than 20 individuals who reviewed materials and made recommendations based on the specific criteria for each scholarship.

"The Foundation is proud to have supported the educational goals of Virgin Islands students for the past 26 years, and we look forward to working with our wonderful donors and students in years to come," said CFVI President Dee Baecher-Brown.

Amira Claxton (pictured), a junior mathematics major at the University of Tampa, received one of the Next Generation Scholar awards for \$2,500. "My goal is to become a professor of mathematics and one day teach at the illustrious University of the Virgin Islands," she said. "Receiving this scholarship means more to me than I can ever express in words."

CFVI Awards \$170,000 in 2022 Youth Summer Program Grants

CFVI awarded \$170,000 in summer program grants to 17 USVI organizations to support a variety of programs serving children and older youth throughout the territory.

Of the total, \$85,000 was distributed to nine organizations on St. Croix, \$55,000 to six grantees on St. Thomas, \$20,000 to two grantees on St. John, and \$10,000 to one organization serving St. Thomas, St. John and Water Island.

Funding priority was focused on applicants who were able to demonstrate the ability to serve children of lower-income families, essential workers, and other families experiencing COVID-related challenges.

CFVI Awards \$50,000 in Humanities Grants

Special funding was awarded from the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) in support of its "A More Perfect Union" initiative

CFVI awarded two \$25,000 humanities grants to the University of the Virgin Islands and St. JanCo. The grants, entitled "A More Perfect Union: Understanding the Importance of Culture and Community in the U.S. Virgin Islands," are funded by the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH).

The **University of the Virgin Islands** was awarded a \$25,000 grant for its "Mosaic Population of the U.S. Virgin Islands" project, which will research, analyze, and collect the history of the U.S. Virgin Islands arts, music, and sports that has led to the current-day cultural melting pot to sustain and preserve a thriving culture and community in the USVI for future generations.

St. JanCo, based in St. John, was awarded a \$25,000 grant for its "Public Libraries: A VI Historical Study" project. The project will study the public libraries and the women after whom they are named: Enid M. Baa, Elaine Ione Sprauve, and Florence A. Williams, to deepen the understanding of gender and its relationship to USVI heritage, culture, society, families, social mores, traditions, norms, behaviors, natural environment, and regional influences.

Family and friends of Maria established the Maria Rodriguez Foundation at CFVI to recognize those who selflessly serve the community of the U.S. and British Virgin Islands.



Grantee Highlights

Children's Museum of St. Croix

When school starts in August, a group of 4- and 5year-olds will have an advantage on that first day because they attended Count Down to Kindergarten



during the summer.

Around 40 children attended the 20-week program, hosted by the <u>Children's Museum of St. Croix</u> and funded with a grant from the Community Foundation of the Virgin Islands. Classes were held one day a week for three hours in two sessions. Parents and grandparents attended workshops while their children learned through enrichment activities how to be successful in school.

According to Ellie Hirsh, Children's Museum board member and Count Down facilitator, the program focused on health, nutrition, social skills as well as

school subjects.

Friends of Virgin Islands National Park

CFVI awarded a grant to

Humanities (NEH), to
produce a seminar series,
entitled Community



Matters, hosted by WTJX/NPR in the Virgin Islands, and curated by the St. Jan Co/Dr. Hadiya Sewer. Those recorded broadcasts served as community engagement events where critical discussions were held on topics pertaining to cultural preservation and the challenges that academics, artisans, educators and citizens face on St. John, and in the Virgin Islands, as a result of, or in relation to, cultural tourism. The grant was also used to fund the production of an audio tour of places on St. John, and in Virgin Islands National Park, as told by St. Johnians and Park Rangers. This piece serves as a timeless self-guided interpretative tool that will be shared with park visitors in the Visitors Center, on the Friends website, and with schools (along with a resource guide of activities for educators).

United Jazz Foundation

CFVI awarded a grant to the <u>United Jazz</u>
<u>Foundation</u>, with funding from the <u>National</u>
<u>Endowment for the Humanities</u> (NEH), to
support the Caribbean Music Institute Online
for junior high, high school, and college
students. The program used music literacy to
enhance students' life skills, social intellect,
music writing and notation skills, and selfdetermination and expanded their knowledge
of musical cultural history to preserve and



sustain the heritage of the U.S. Virgin Islands. Courses included music technology classes, workshops, ensembles, private instruction, and recording sessions utilizing the enormously rich palette of the fundamental abilities that music education gives access to.

St. George Village Botanical Garden

CFVI awarded a grant to the St. George
Village Botanical Garden, with funding from
the National Endowment for the
Humanities (NEH), to relocate and create an
enlarged African Provision Garden (APG).
The garden was planted with crops enslaved
peoples used to augment their diets, to tell
the story of the enslaved peoples and postemancipation workers. Signage identifies the
plants, their origin and their usage, as well as
information on why these gardens played an
important role for enslaved people, and then
the post-emancipation plantation workers.



The project offers both horticultural and historical education as well as expanding an awareness of the plight of the enslaved as they attempted to survive their harsh lives, and how they forged a new culture in which food played and continues to play a prominent role in identity.
