## Message from the Chairman and the President

It's not unusual for one of CFVI's closest friends and supporters to say, "I didn't know CFVI did that!" So we'd like to take a moment in this letter to summarize the work of the Community Foundation.

CFVI gives away more than \$1.5 million every year in grants, scholarships and services throughout the Virgin Islands. CFVI works with donors to provide information and guidance to assist them with achieving their philanthropic goals through grant-making and program support. CFVI provides financial oversight to assure donors that their contributions are used in a way that is consistent with IRS regulations and are tax-deductible to the fullest extent permitted by law. CFVI's financial statements are audited each year by an independent financial auditor.

CFVI helps by creating programs to address needs in the community. CFVI currently administers 17 programs (plus an additional 16 scholarship programs) including Anderson Teacher Grants; Junior Angels; Dictionary Project (+ Thesauruses & Atlases); Hodge Senior Citizen Assistance; Junior Philanthropists; Next Generation Scholars; KIDS COUNT; Laws

of Life; Mini-Grants; Rapid Response Grants; Time for Kids; VI Cancer Patient; and The Family Connection, which is the Foundation's major early childhood initiative. **CFVI also provides free fiscal sponsorships** to assist smaller non-profit initiatives with the financial and reporting requirements, including Dancing Classrooms of the VI, Horse Welfare Foundation, Camp Shriver, HUGS, Smith Bay Community Action and Patient Assist VI.

How is the work of CFVI funded? CFVI is unique among community foundations because we charge no administrative fees to our Funds or Programs. Generous CFVI Angel donations of \$500 or greater support all programs, operating costs, and much of CFVI community outreach each year. Our 2013 campaign is in progress now! # TFC Center's Grand Opening

More than 100 parents, children and community members attended the opening of the new and expanded TFC Center in Tutu Park Mall. TFC is a free resource center and lending library which provides children's books and toys as well as educational and professional development materials related to early childhood education.

The center is an oasis for parents with young children to come to and engage in play and reading or to participate in activities such as movement and music, painting and drawing, story hours, and Dad and me. It is specifically designed for an audience of young children and their siblings, mothers, fathers, grandparents as well as child care providers and teachers on St. Thomas. Children and their parents can engage in various learning activities including: making playdough, building structures with recyclable objects, science investigations.

The TFC Center is open Tuesday through Saturday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. to accommodate parents' and teachers' schedules. TFC is located near the entrance of Domino's, and in the vicinity of St. Thomas East End Medical Center and WIC (Women, Infants and Children) offices. # **Text4Baby Holds Baby Shower**

First Lady Cecile de Jongh in partnership with The Family Connection, a CFVI program, and the Early Childhood Advisory Committee, a committee of the governor's Children and Families Council, hosted two text4baby baby showers—one on St. Thomas and one on St. Croix. These two events welcomed expectant expectant mothers at a baby shower held moms and dads who signed up for the text4baby free text messaging service.

Text4baby is a partnership with the national text4baby program that provides maternal and child health tips and reminders for expecting and new parents with babies up to one year of age. The goal is to elevate the conversation about healthy pregnancies, including how to maintain a healthy lifestyle after childbirth and to encourage early education and proper care, from the start.

# Kimelman Family \$50,000 Challenge

CFVI has received a challenge grant of \$50,000 from the Kimelman Family in support of TFC. The Kimelman grant is designed to provide an added incentive to Virgin Islands businesses to support early childhood excellence in the Virgin Islands.

The Kimelman Family will provide a dollar-for-dollar match, up to \$50,000 total, for every new donation of \$2,500 or more made by a business to The Family Connection. To encourage long-term commitment on the part of businesses, the Kimelman grant would require a second-year pledge as

Businesses are stepping up to help, recognizing what recent research has documented: that early childhood programs can pay high returns in terms of subsequent educational attainment and in lower rates of social problems, such as teenage pregnancy and welfare dependency.

A donation is eligible to be matched by the challenge grant if it is:

- a first-time cash contribution to TFC from a business or corporation;
- made during the 12-month time frame of Oct. 1, 2012 to Sept. 30, 2013;
- a pledge to give an identical amount in year two; and
- in the range of at least \$2,500 a year (i.e. \$5,000 over two years) up to a maximum donation of \$25,000 a year (i.e. \$50,000 over two years).

# Marine Vocational Program VI Receives Grant

The Boy Scouts' pilot Marine Vocational Program (MVP), because of its measurable success, is seeking to expand the MVP to include more students and classes. The MVP received its first grant award of \$5,000



from CFVI. Millions of visitors come to St. Thomas each year to swim, dive, sail and sport fish. Now, through the MVP, the goal is to introduce young islanders to a variety of water sports so that they can turn this sea-worthy asset into a career provider in the future.

#### **AT&T Awards Grants**

Atlas Project – The AT&T Foundation presented an award of \$10,000 to CFVI to support the creation of Project Atlas. This project provided paperback atlases to every public and private school 7th grader in the Territory. These books will complement their world geography studies. Approximately 1,900 books have been distributed to date.

Arts Alive – In response to a second grant application made to the AT&T Foundation, CFVI received a \$25,000 grant award to support the Arts Alive Student Performance Initiative & Youth Scholarship Program. This scholarship program will support young talented Virgin Islands artists and musicians in their quest to further their education through attending offisland workshops, camps and colleges during the summer of 2013.

## **Anderson Family Fund Gives Teacher Grants**

The Anderson Family Fund "Teacher Grants Program" provided funding on a competitive basis for projects that seek to improve student achievement. Recipients of these included 29 teachers and paraprofessionals working with 17 schools on St. Croix, St. Thomas and St. John. Two other grants supported efforts in multiple schools. A total of \$25,000 in grants ranging from \$500 to \$1,000 each was awarded in 2012.

# VI Scholars Summer Leadership Institute

In its second year, the VI Scholars Summer Leadership Institute returned to St. John with its free, three-week program. The Institute offered daily sessions focusing on how to succeed, motivate others and improve their communities to 13 public, private, and parochial high school students from St. Thomas and St. John. These students formed groups in which each conceived a different way to impact their community. VI Scholars is under the fiscal umbrella of CFVI.

#### St. Ursula's Center Received Donation



With the assistance of a \$2,000 grant CFVI and other donors on St. Thomas and St. John, the seniors attending the daily meal program at St. Ursula's Multipurpose Center on St. John have had their transportation service restored. This service is especially important for those who cannot or do not drive and do not have friends or relatives who can assist them with

transportation to the center daily where they fellowship and take part in the lunch program.

Discussions included the introduction of important new data points to be collected and reported.

Working with the KIDS COUNT staff and CFVI, the PRB will compile, analyze and publish this year an overview of Census 2010 findings on the well-being of children and families in the Territory.
