Community Foundation of the Virgin Islands selects first-ever Rashida A. Hodge Scholarship recipient

Adaina Smith of St. Croix has been selected as the inaugural recipient of the Rashida A. Hodge Scholarship, the transformational award that provides full tuition, fees, housing and mentorship for up to four years at North Carolina State University. The scholarship was established through a \$1 million endowment created by NC State alumna and Microsoft executive Rashida Hodge in partnership with CFVI, where she also serves as a board member.

A spotlight on our grantees and community impact

St. Croix Swimming Association



Every Child A Swimmer

The 2025 Banco Popular Grant supported the St. Croix Swimming Association's Every Child A Swimmer Program, providing free swim lessons to 78 children aged 4-11 from local public schools. The program successfully taught water safety skills, reducing drowning risk and helping children develop confidence in swimming. Many participants who initially feared water transformed into confident swimmers, highlighting the program's significant impact on children without prior access to swim instruction.

St. John Rescue



St. John Junior Rescue Squad

The St. John Junior Rescue Squad program engaged 16 students in comprehensive emergency response training, covering life-saving skills like CPR, AED and First Aid. Participants experienced diverse field trips to Vitema, 911 Control Center, a pediatric expo and the Bureau of Corrections, which provided unique insights into emergency services. The program, led by instructors Bob Malacarne, Jacki Browne, Landry Boysen, Brett Huntley, and Valerie Boysen, was particularly notable for the students' success in winning a CPR compression competition against VIFEMS.

The University of the Virgin Islands (UVI)



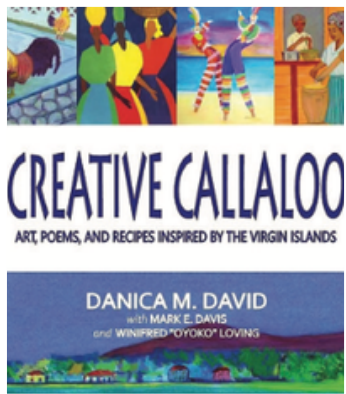
Collaboration & Conversations: Connecting Virgin Islands Historical Collections & Community Knowledge to an Emerging Generation of Humanities Scholars

This grant was used to expand UVI's Oral History Curriculum by creating an ongoing collaboration with existing Oral Historians; Virgin Islands Museums, Libraries, and Archives; and Curriculum Developers and Educators in the Virgin Islands. This funding created a launching pad for new undergraduate researchers working on Virgin Islands history – complete with scripted and UVI student produced introductory videos, a UVI Library Lib Guide and a presentation at a major national conference.

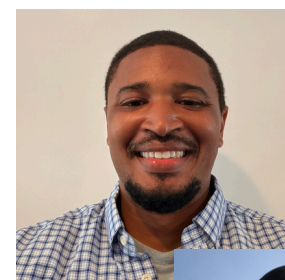
2026 Youth Selection: *Broo 'Nansi and Hummingbird*
