In 2025, we supported 60 Virgin Islands students, and we look forward to continuing that impact in 2026. CFVI hosts *Voices of the VI* Humanities Conference at UVI

The Voices of the VI: Dialogue & Discovery Humanities Conference brought together community leaders, scholars, artists, and cultural practitioners for two days of reflection and collaboration. Held as part of the [By the People: Conversations Beyond 250](#) initiative, the event featured keynote addresses from CFVI President Dee Baecher-Brown and UVI President Dr. Safiyah George, alongside a series of panel discussions that explored themes such as cultural preservation, storytelling, historical memory, and the role of the humanities in shaping our future. Through these sessions, speakers shared insights on the importance of safeguarding the Virgin Islands' cultural heritage while also fostering community collaboration. 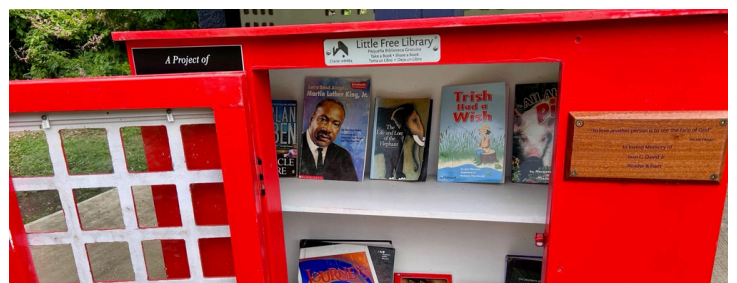

CULTIVATING CHANGE

A spotlight on our grantees and community impact

Friends of the VI National Park



Funded by the Edward S. Moore Family Foundation

The 2025 Summer Trail Crew included 11 Virgin Islands students (ages 15–18) in an eight-week conservation and skills program. With CFVI's support, the crew maintained 20+ miles of trails, preserved historic sites, and contributed to environmental restoration while building leadership, teamwork, and professional skills. By combining hands-on trail work with environmental education and community engagement, the program not only maintained park resources but prepared generations of Virgin Islands youth to become lifelong conservation stewards and active community leaders.

Engineers for Tomorrow Outreach



Funded by the Margaritaville Wyndham Educational Fund

This grant supported 13 hands-on engineering workshops for youth ages 8–13, including nine through the Wesley Methodist After-School Program and four open Saturday sessions. Participants explored topics like generators, solar cars, traffic lights, bridges, and AI by designing and building their own projects. Students gained practical skills and real-world insight into engineering—learning how everyday technologies work while becoming active creators and problem-solvers.

Lutheran Social Services of the Virgin Islands



Funded by the Popular VI Community Fund

Through support from the Empowerment Through Enterprise grant, adolescent girls at the Queen Louise Home for Children gained hands-on experience in entrepreneurship, financial literacy, and business development. Participants launched three youth-led businesses producing Madras toddler apparel, handmade jewelry, and customized beauty products and cosmetology services. Through a Youth Business Acceleration Course, expert-led workshops, and community pop-up markets, students built skills in business planning, budgeting, marketing, and customer engagement.

Dolly Parton Imagination Library expands with CFVI funding

The Dolly Parton Imagination Library Program is a no-cost book gifting program that mails high-quality books to children from birth until they begin school. Since 2018, CFVI has been a proud supporter via grants made to the Virgin Islands Children’s Museum, the USVI steward for the program.

The most recent grant award from CFVI will further support the expansion of the program, covering current enrollment and projected growth in 2026. The grant funds will be utilized to cover the costs of providing free books to children, as well as support administrative and marketing expenses to reach more families in the USVI.

Since inception, the Dolly Parton Imagination Library has gifted more than 137,000 books to 2,500+ children throughout the territory. [Click to learn more about the program.](#)

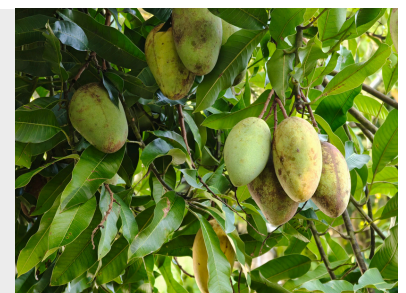


CFVI and Lutheran Social Services host tent at 2026 Agriculture Fair
